Do You Ever Just Feel Worn Down?


You Really Just Need More of Something but Aren't Sure What

s Summer concludes, we express our gratitude for the invaluable contributions of the workgroups. Our unwavering focus remains steadfast: to glorify God through diligent study of His Word (we are currently reading/studying Nehemiah), to walk confidently in our faith (we firmly believe in the Word of God and its promises), to rely on the boundless grace of God (we engage in multiple obstacle courses daily, sometimes successfully - sometimes, not so), and to joyfully celebrate Jesus Christ and His impact through us.

Our recent days have been filled with workgroups, lunches, bunkhouse dinners, and ample opportunities for swimming and fishing as we embarked on an incredible summer of workgroups. This past June has been particularly meaningful as we, now a Shiloh family, have been hosting workgroups instead of visiting as part of a workgroup. From joining in prayer around our breakfast, lunch, and dinner table to sharing stories, experiences, and lessons around the fire pit, we have witnessed testimonies of God's grace, victorious past trials, and faithful future plans.
