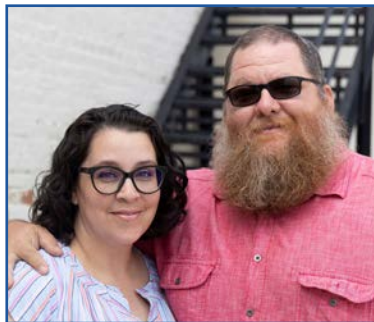
All too Often Our Kids Carry a Lot of Hurt

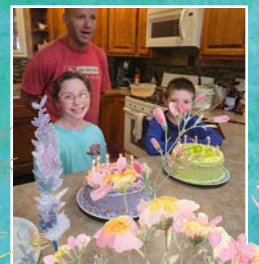

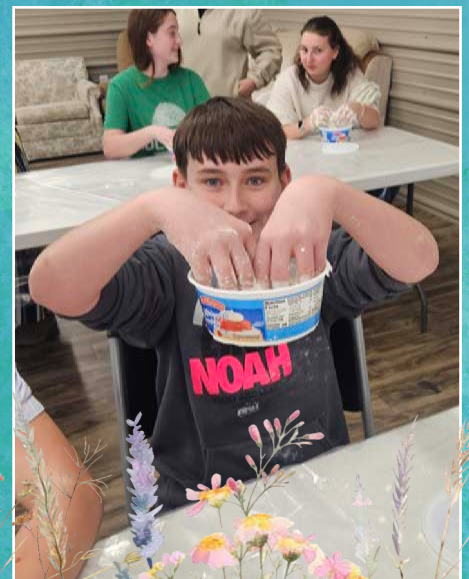
