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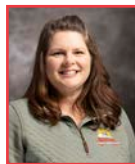

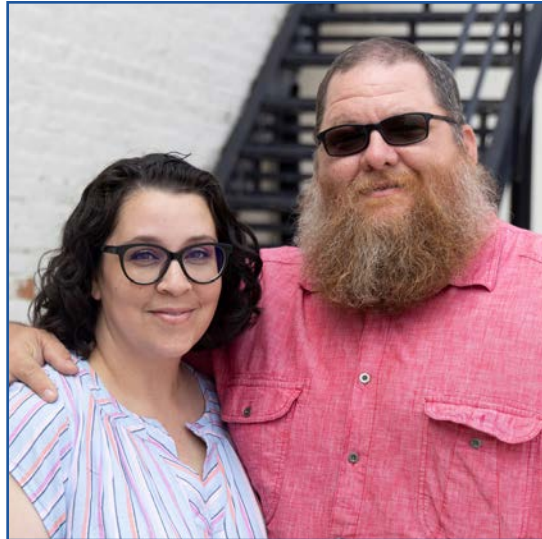

Dear Friends of Shiloh Christian Children's Ranch, It amazes us each time we think of you, and how there are so many that live so far away that we will never meet, but you faithfully pray for us and send in support so we are able to serve kids, meet needs, and meet the ultimate need by sharing Jesus with them. Here is a bit about what's been going on during the last three months.

“Too Outlandish to Succeed ...Without Christ!”

I Refuse to Sugar-Coat Reality

During the oppressive days of the Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln would often slip a few blocks away to a Wednesday evening service at the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church seeking encouragement and comfort through the sermon. After a rather dramatic presentation by Dr. Phineas Gurley, his young aide asked the President's opinion. Lincoln responded, *“It was well thought out, powerfully delivered and very eloquent.”* The aide said, *“Then you thought it was a great sermon.”*

“No,” He replied. *“It failed because Dr. Gurley did not ask us to do something great.”*¹

By contrast, consider Colonel Joshua Chamberlain's leadership at Little Round Top during the Battle of Gettysburg. A college literature professor of rhetoric and oratory by training, Chamberlain's most ironically inspirational speech consisted of a single word. Three syllables uttered at a crucial moment turned the tide of the battle and eventually the entire Civil War: **“BAYONET!”**

Amid the din of battle, the soldiers of the 20th Maine Regiment comprehended, responded and charged downhill without even being told to charge forward. What type of **heart** does it take to *“...do something great”* in a time of tremendous challenge?

As we approach the 50th Anniversary of Shiloh's founding, there's an even greater battle facing us. Not a

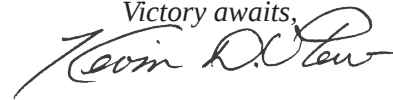
fiery battle for a stony outcropping in southern Pennsylvania, but the pitch, eternal battle for children's souls. Welcoming **Adam and Marcie Gregory** alongside us will help us eventually care for 50+ youngsters.

I refuse to sugar-coat reality; helping more kids will increase our monthly operating expenses. But the options are either putting children on hold or turning them away outright. That's just not how battles are won.

So, what you and I don't need today is a message that is *“...well thought out, powerfully delivered and very eloquent.”* I will simply appeal to the spiritual warrior within each of us to assess the battlefield before us, seek God's guidance and move forward with Christ to victory via just three syllables:

“PRAY, then GIVE!” ■

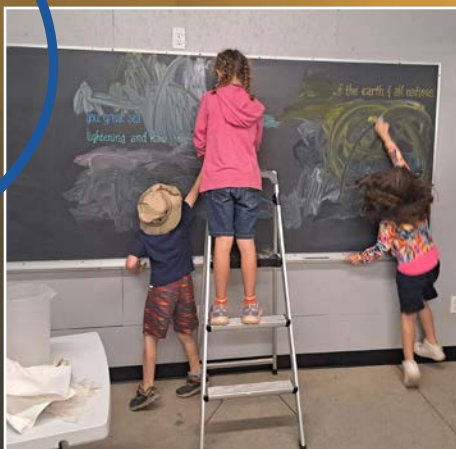
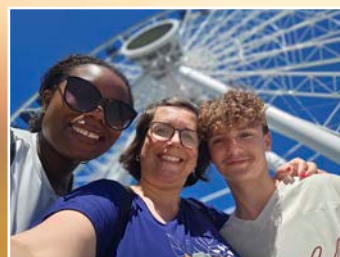
